About AIISH

It is a premier institute in the country imparting training in the field of speech and hearing. The Institute aims at manpower development, research and rehabilitation in the area of communication disorders. The institute is located on a sprawling area of 32 acres (two campuses) in Mysuru.

The Centre of Swallowing Disorders (CSD) housed under the Centre of Excellence is a unique facility of AIISH and is also one of its kind in the country. Children with feeding and/or swallowing difficulties are of great concern for parents and their failure to acquire adequate nutrition and hydration adversely affects multitude of developmental domains. Currently, there is a great level of emphasis on maternal and child health not only at the primary health care but also at the level of national policies of the Government of India. This scientific event is a platform for all interested health care professionals to join hands in their work towards transforming the quality of care extended to families of children with feeding and swallowing difficulties. The program will discuss, deliberate, and brainstorm on the scope for improvement in clinical care for this population.
